## <u>STATEMENT REGARDING COMPLIANCE WITH OCTOBER 22 ORDER</u> <u>& LIMITED REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION/RELIEF</u>

On October 22, 2018, the Special Discovery Master Ordered the following:

State is Ordered to produce within 30 working days from the date of this order, final and complete responses and production, subject to newly discovered evidence required to be produced, relevant production in support of State's evidentiary proof model and Defendants' defense thereto, from the Office of the Medical Examiner, Oklahoma Department of Public Safety, Oklahoma State Board of Dentistry, Oklahoma State Board of Nursing, Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy and the Oklahoma State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners, all subject to previous

orders entered regarding protection of physician and patient privacy information.

Since the October 22 Order, the State has continued to consistently produce documents pursuant to the ordinary rolling-production schedule ordered by the Court. Specifically, since October 22, the State has produced:

- 29,533 documents, totaling 445,057 pages, from the Oklahoma Health Care Authority;
- 1,079 documents, totaling 10,363 pages, from the Oklahoma State Department of Health;
- 129 documents, totaling 929 pages, from the Oklahoma State Medical Board;
- 50 documents, totaling 117 pages, from the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics & Dangerous Drugs;
- 88 documents, totaling 503 pages, from the Oklahoma State Board of Osteopathic Examiners;
- 1 document, totaling 625 pages, from the American Pain Society;
- 242 documents, totaling 879 pages, from the American Geriatrics Society; and
- 8,749 documents, totaling 37,602 pages, from the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse Services.

And, with respect to the agencies listed in the October 22 Order in particular, the State has produced:

- 23,454 documents, totaling 148,586 pages, from the Oklahoma Office of the Chief Medical Examiner;
- 1,830 documents, totaling 12,430 pages, from the Oklahoma Board of Nursing;
- 51 documents, totaling 606 pages, from the Oklahoma Board of Dentistry;
- 6,057 documents, totaling 43,997 pages, from the Oklahoma State Board of Pharmacy; and
- 12,707 documents, totaling 45,592 pages, from the Oklahoma State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners.

In sum, since October 22, the State has produced 83,970 documents for a total of 747,286 pages. To date, the State has produced a total of 122,010 documents, consisting of 1,322,669 pages, in this litigation.

The State has operated in good faith to complete production of documents from the agencies listed in the October 22 Order by the date ordered. Rather than simply begin production from these agencies and continue along the normal rolling schedule for this case, the State has invested considerable resources to expedite the production and review related to these agencies in an attempt to achieve "complete . . . production" by the date contemplated in the Order. To date, since the October 22 Order, the State has worked diligently to comply with this interpretation of the Court's Order and has produced a total of 44,099 documents, totaling 251,211 pages, from the State Agencies listed in the October 22 Order.

While the State expects to substantially complete production under the October 22 Order by the date ordered, to the extent the Order requires complete production, the State respectfully requests additional time to produce certain information from two of the listed agencies. First, while the State has already completed production of over 6,000 documents from the Board of Pharmacy, the State expects to substantially complete production, producing several thousand more documents from this agency, by the beginning of next week. Second, the Board of Dentistry has collected additional documents for review and production but will require additional time to finish the collection and review process. The State aims to substantially complete production for the Board of Dentistry within thirty working days. If any additional documents are discovered from any of the listed agencies, the State will continue to produce such documents.

In sum, the State has substantially completed production in compliance with the October 22 Order, as described above. To the extent such is necessary, the State requests an additional

thirty working days in which to substantially complete its production from the Board of Pharmacy and the Board of Dentistry.
