PURDUE'S JOINDER TO JANSSEN DEFENDANTS' EMERGENCY MOTION FOR ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

Purdue Pharma, L.P., Purdue Pharma, Inc., and The Purdue Frederick Company (collectively "Purdue") respectfully submit this Joinder to the Emergency Motion for Order to Show Cause filed by Defendants Johnson & Johnson, Inc., Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc., Ortho-McNeil-Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc., and Janssen Pharmaceutica, Inc. (collectively "Janssen") on March 12, 2019.

On February 18, 2019, the Discovery Master issued a Discovery Order, ruling on

Defendants' February 12, 2019 Emergency Motion to Compel. The State was ordered to

produce identified data in "cross-walked form" to Defendants, including Purdue, no later

than March 1, 2019. As Janssen explains in its motion, the State repeatedly represented that

it would provide this data in a usable form so that Defendants can identify specific

individuals across the State's databases. In brief, as Janssen explains in its motion, the State

has not complied with the February 18 Order, by failing to produce the data identified in the

Order in a usable, fully "cross-walked form," now more than 10 days after the deadline.

Accordingly, Janssen has moved for an Order to Show Cause regarding this failure to

comply with the February 18 Order. Because the arguments and reasoning set forth by Janssen

in its motion apply equally here to the State's failure to produce the data in a usable form to

Purdue, Purdue joins Janssen's motion and incorporates by reference the points and authorities

set forth therein. The Discovery Master should order the State to show cause as to why its

failure to comply with the Order should not preclude the State from pursuing related allegations

at trial, including any allegation that Purdue opioid prescriptions led to deaths from overdose or

abuse.

For these reasons, and the reasons set forth in Janssen's Motion for Order to Show Cause,

Purdue respectfully requests that the Discovery Master order the State to show cause why

appropriate evidentiary preclusions should not be imposed based on the State's failure to comply

with the Discovery Master's February 18, 2019 Order or otherwise provide relevant discovery in

its sole possession, custody and control.
