MOS was at work today. He slammed a sick report on the Sgt's desk & said he was going out sick. Sgt told him to stick around & he refused & left. Didn't follow procedures. Typically, they call sick desks until for command to arrange coverages. MOS was working on TS, command to arrange coverages. MOS was working on TS.

MOS did not go straight home. CoPs are at his home waiting for his arrival. They called MOS on his cell phone. They think he picked up & then hung up. Since then, no answer. They are thinking of grounding him but they suspect it is more of a psych problem. XO of MOS' command (818th) is Capt Lauterborn & request response from 1st. — C. J. Foster/Pyo

H/C - Capt Lauterborn

MOS doing a 7-3 day tour today, at TS all day. All was fine. He typically keeps to self & doesn't converse much with other officers, odd son today. Nothing seemed out of ordinary.

2PM - he went down to take run, charged & then put a sick report on Sgt's desk & said going sick. He wrote that he had stomach pains. Sgt tried to stop him but he left anyway.

Underlying issue - MOS has made allegations against others. Dept's investigation of those allegations picked up this week & it snowballed from there. This week, about 4 POCs & 2 civilian people were called down for questioning. MOS goes up to Fleet & asks about it, notifications are in telephone message log so he knows who is doing. When he returns, he tries to intercept them & get info from them about what he was asked. Today was 1st tour back after RDO's. Not sure what happened today that triggered him to leave like that.

D. delayed paying off & Capt L. all left
his garage & asked him to go back to command

A Lt is at his home. His car is there.

Junkard said Mos may have been there earlier. Command
told Mos' potatoes were here. Mos not ~~there~~ here.

- I left a msg on Mos' cell phone of you my
cell # & Capt L's cell phone. It told him that Capt
said he could just return to his home right then if he wanted to
go to the command, I urged him to go home or call L Capt
so this could be resolved quickly & easily w/o need
for a trip down b/w roads. I think of him, or simply
with the suspension, Mos doesn't just make it
quickly & easily now. I explained that we are in just
concern of his safety & they want to make sure he is ok

- H/C Capt Hauerborn - I urged Capt that he left
msg on Mos' cell phone as described above. I suggested Capt
call Mos' father b/c that's the person he is closest to & the
person who is most likely to know his whereabouts. Capt will
call w/s when he gets a break from Mos.

1750 hours. Delayed entry made on 10/14/10, in reviewing
further, the below info was found to not be documented in prior note, but
is clear & US' memory. Capt Lauterborn asked if Mos was
suicidal or depressed, because he needed to know how concerned they
should be about Mos' safety given his going truly not knowing where
calls, not knowing day or time but knew who they were & informed
Capt that at last saw Mos at PES on 10/27/09 & at that time
he looked ok & reported being asymptomatic. At no time had he
ever expressed thoughts of suicide, but he also never was suicidal
& stated the way he was acting on 10/31/09. My assessment of his
suicidal risk to only as good for the last time I saw him. If suicide
happened after that & led him to be as upset that he left work
without permission or home before the end of his tour, said to have
stomach pains, etc., then I am unable to say with any reasonable
amount of certainty that he is not at risk of SU under present
circumstances. I provided Capt with brief up short reason
Mos was on R/D — that he had significant physical & emotional
(mainly GI & Cardiac symptoms, etc.). Unbeknownst to Mos was
reportedly operating on 10/27/09 when he said all of his GI went away
w/o Tx. Most likely to minimize in that he did not want to be on PRD,
he was often denying initial and later denied any & all GI symptoms
mentioning symptoms, when also expressing being afraid about being on PRD. His report
on 10/31/09 that he had stomach pains were enough to merit being sent home
end of tour, up primary suspect initially the GI then did go away in
they occurred on 10/31/09 due to his being really upset about something.
It is also possible there was a medical cause for the stomach pain
but the angry manner in which he left work suggests a psych. cause.

Mos sd "why wouldn't no one care worked about me before" He refused to go to command & kept saying he didn't feel well. Called ambulance EMT took his vitals.

BP very high. 170/120.

EMT wanted him to go to hospital b/c BP so high, Mos & opt^o then refused, He ran back inside & had to be strapped down & forcibly taken to Transo Hosp. 01 Mos ~~said~~ he wanted to sleep at home & run to ER on own the next day, but EMT couldn't allow that bc BP so high. Chief Melling was there & suspended him.

MOS was very disrespectful in every way, Chief gave him so much room but Mos out of control & too bad disposed for supervisor.

Whole time talking & jocking on cell phone could hear father yelling, (at Mos or to him about situation?) not at Mos, Father angry about Melling's handling of this or other situations & Mos, Father doesn't have accurate info, in my opinion.
